Yeats, E. M. Forster, Marcel Proust, Paul de Man, and Jacques Derrida from the exquisite close readings for which he is celebrated, Miller reaps a capacious understanding of otherness, one reachable not through theory but through literature itself. As the plural in the title, *Others* indicates we perceive otherness in the way that the unseen and the characters' emotional responses to it ripple the conservative ideological surface of Howard's *End*. We sense it as chaos in Schlegel's radical concept of irony, and we gaze at it in the multiple personifications of *Heart of Darkness*. Each testifies in its own way to the richness and tangible weight of an otherness close at hand.
